# Timeline for Scheduling

**January 25-30 - Classroom Meetings**

**February 1 - Scheduling window opens**

**February 15 - Scheduling window closes**

**March - April - Mr. Brannen creates the 'master schedule'**

**May - Counselors place students in schedules**

**May 25 (last day of school) - Students receive schedules!**



# Graduation Requirements

**Religion - 4 credits (exception for transfers)**

**Electives - 7 credits for a total of 24 credits**

**Must have a 3.0 GPA to be eligible.**

\*taught online - section reserved for SHDHS only

TMU Fall: HIS 203 (Modern Europe I)

TMU Spring: HIS 204 (Modern Europe II)

\*taught in-person with Bridget Kaiser-Munday as the TMU professor

# Processes and Procedures

1. Review Scheduling Form with teachers
2. Log in to TylerSIS
3. Choose link for “Course Requests may now be entered”
4. Go through department by department
5. Click the box by the appropriate courses
  - a. Only pick courses you are allowed to take (grade level)
  - b. Choose enough courses to equal 6 periods (*Religion is automatic*)
  - c. Be aware of half credits
6. Click SAVE
7. Edits can be made after saving
8. Parent signs Scheduling Form
9. Student returns Scheduling Form to Counselors

  - a. English teacher signature**
  - b. Math teacher signature**
- 2. Choose courses rather than teachers**
- 3. Seek balance in your life**
