# Graduation Requirements

Religion - 4 credits (exception for transfers)

**English - 4 credits** 

Math - 4 credits (must complete Alg I, Alg II and Geometry)

Social Studies - 3 credits (World, US and Gov/Econ)

Science - 3 credits (3 Lab Sciences including Biology & Chemistry)

Health/PE - ½ credit each

Fine Arts - 1 credit

**Electives - 7 credits for a total of 24 credits**

# Timeline for Scheduling

- January 23rd 24th Grade level meetings during Flex, Cru 101 & AP Human
- February 15 Students will receive a hard copy of their course request form \*Students continue conversations with teachers about the courses they are recommended to take next year.
- February 21 Students will learn how to enter their course requests in Powerschool
- March 4 The course request window closes
- March April Admin creates the 'master schedule'
- May Counselors places students in schedules
- ASAP in the summer Students receive class schedules!
