Graduation Requirements

Religion - 4 credits (exception for transfers)

English - 4 credits

Math - 4 credits (must complete Alg I, Alg II and Geometry)

Social Studies - 3 credits (World, US and Gov/Econ)

Science - 3 credits (3 Lab Sciences including Biology & Chemistry)

Health/PE - ½ credit each

Fine Arts - 1 credit

Electives - 7 credits for a total of 24 credits



Pre-College Curriculum Recommendations

Religion - 4 credits (exception for transfers)

English - 4 credits

Math - 4 credits (must complete Alg I, Alg II and Geometry)

Social Studies - 3 credits (World, US and Gov/Econ)

Science - 3 credits (3 Lab Sciences including Biology & Chemistry)

Health/PE - ½ credit each

Fine Arts - 1 credit



World Languages - 2 credits of the same language

Timeline for Scheduling

- February 3 Parent Scheduling Information Night at 6pm
- Week of February 3 Grade level meetings
 - Students will receive a copy of their course request form
- February 10 Course request window opens
 *Students continue conversations with teachers about the courses they are recommended to take next year.
- February 19-21 Students will enter their courses into PowerSchool during Flex
- February 21 The course request window closes
- March April Admin creates the 'master schedule'
- May Counselors place students in schedules
- Summer Students receive class schedules!
