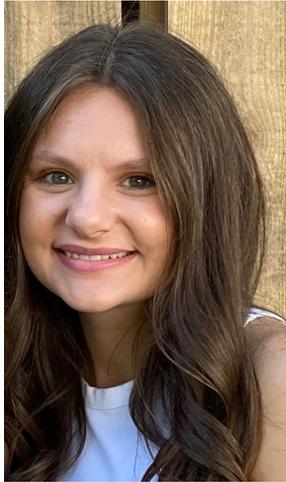

Graduation Requirements

Religion - 4 credits (exception for transfers)

English - 4 credits

Math - 4 credits (must complete Alg I, Algebra II, and Geometry)

Social Studies - 3 credits (World, US and Gov/Econ)

Science - 3 credits (Biology, Chemistry, one more science course)

Health/PE - ½ credit each

Fine Arts - 1 credit

Electives - 7 credits for a total of 24 credits



Pre-College Curriculum Recommendations

Religion - 4 credits (exception for transfers)

English - 4 credits

Math - 4 credits (must complete Alg I, Alg II and Geometry)

Social Studies - 3 credits (World, US and Gov/Econ)

Science - 3 credits (Biology, Chemistry, one more science course)

Health/PE - ½ credit each

Fine Arts - 1 credit

World Languages - 2 credits of the same language

Course Option Highlights - Dual Credit

State of Kentucky awards 2 free dual credit classes for junior year and 2 free dual credit classes for senior year.

Must have a 3.0 GPA to be eligible. An ACT score is required for some classes. (mostly math and science) Some courses have prerequisites.

Timeline for Scheduling

- **February 27 - Counselors present in classrooms regarding 2026-2027 scheduling process; students are able to see teacher recommendations in PowerSchool**
- **March 2-12 - Students continue conversations with teachers about the courses they are recommended to take next year**
- **March 12 - Students will enter their course requests into PowerSchool during Flex**
- **March - April - Admin creates the 'master schedule'**
- **May - Counselors place students in schedules**
- **ASAP in the summer - Students receive class schedules!**

Teacher Course Recommendations

- **Course recommendations from teachers are based on aptitude, work ethic, classroom performance and participation, conversations with student about post-secondary plans**
- **If a student would like to take a class for which they are not recommended:**
 - **Step 1: Speak with teacher (teachers can change the recommendation)**
 - **Step 2: If the teacher does not change their recommendation, student must complete a waiver form. *Available in Schoology; parent signature required**
 - **Step 3: On March 12 students still have to register for the courses they are recommended to take. Waiver forms will be reviewed before any changes are made**



Good Requesting

- 1. Consult teachers for next level**
- 2. Choose courses rather than teachers**
- 3. Strive to be challenged, not overwhelmed**
- 4. Seek balance in your life (mind, body, spirit)**

Dual Credit Internship Vocational School



Dual Credit Program

- **Gateway, NKU, Thomas More**
- **One free dual credit course each semester during their junior and senior years**
- **Must have a 3.0 GPA to be eligible. ACT may be required for some courses**
- **SHDHS application + Dual Credit application**
- **Course delivery options**
 - **In-person at SHDHS**
 - **Online**
 - **In-person at university campus - depends on student / university schedule**



Internship Program

- **St. Elizabeth Internship Program or student will find their own**
- **Senior year only**
- **Attendance + Discipline**
- **SHDHS application + Committee interview**
- **Business etiquette and interview training workshop**
- **Time commitment**
 - **7.5 hours each week**
 - **6th and 7th periods or after**
- **Presentation and research paper**
- **Deadline for students to finalize internship placement is TBD**



Vocational School Program

- **Boone County Area Technology Center (BCATC), Gateway, Enzweiler Institute**
- **Junior and senior years**
 - **BCATC - Junior year mornings; Senior year afternoons**
 - **Gateway - based on university schedule**
 - **Enzweiler Institute - depending on program**
- **Attendance + Discipline (GPA requirement for some courses)**
- **SHDHS application + Committee interview**



Vocational School Course Options
